#### 2. Minutes of the General Assembly held in Kyoto 2014

SFRR regional societies had been emailed the finalised Minutes from the General Assembly held in Kyoto 2014 and these had been approved.

#### 3. Report of the President

Rafael Radi welcomed Shinya Toyokuni as the next SFRRI President. He expressed his thanks and that of the SFRRI Executive and Committee to Neil Hogg and his local team (Kent Lindeman, Lori Pearson and their staff) for organising such a successful joint meeting of SfRBM and SFRRI in San Francisco. Rafael Radi reviewed the achievement of SFRRI, highlighting his mission to further strengthen the role of SFRRI Subcommittees for Finance, Education and Training and Meetings. Although the SFRRI Executive had asked regional Societies to nominate two names each, the take-up was limited. The SFRRI Executive had agreed in its Committee Meeting to try to reactivate this initiative in order to broaden involvement of regional members in SFRRI.

Rafael Radi also informed the General Assembly that the SFRRI Executive would be announcing a Call for Nominations for the next SFRRI President-Elect on the SFRRI main website and in an email sent to the regional SFRR societies by the Giovanni Mann, the SFRRI Secretary General.. A form for such requests had been drafted and was available on the SFRRI website.

#### 4. Report of the Secretary General

Giovanni Mann briefly reviewed the current SFRRI website and encouraged regional societies to email him further information for uploading onto the website. He further announced that the SFRRI Executive had approved a redesign of the current SFRRI website which would offer the membership access online via a desktop computer, tablet and mobile phone. In the meantime, members are referred to the existing SFRRI website (<a href="http://www.sfrr.org">http://www.sfrr.org</a>) for updates on forth-coming scientific meetings, call for SFRRI Executive Officer nominations and other information.

Michael Davies reported that the SFRRI Committee had agreed with other senior SFRR colleagues to create a historical perspective of the Society on the SFFRI website and encouraged all colleagues with knowledge of the history of SFRRI to email documentation to him.

#### 5. Report of the Treasurer

Giovanni Mann informed the General Assembly that due to issues with the Society's HSBC Banking mandate and online banking facilities, a formal Treasurer's Report could not be presented to the membership at this time. A Treasurer Report would be completed within the next month and then sent to the regional SFRR societies and Malcolm Jackson, so that SFRRI could submit a report to the UK Charity Commission. SFRRI assets held in UK Sterling at the HSBC Bank in London at 23 June 2016 were £78,507.18.

#### 6. Report of the President-Elect

Shinya Toyokuni provided an overview of the 17<sup>th</sup> SFRRI Meeting held in Kyoto, Japan 2014, high lighting that profits of this meetings were returned to SFRRI and SFRR Asia. Further information is available in the attached summary report. The SFRRI Executive congratulated Shinya Toyokuni and Yuji Naito for co-organising such a successful meeting. As highlighted in the report, SFRRI Kyoto 2014 attracted a total of 621 delegates with 280 from 30 countries.

Shinya Toyokuni briefly outlined his vision for SFRRI, highlighting the importance of increasing the membership from SFRR regions such as India, China and Africa. He further commented that he

Giovanni Mann informed the General Assembly that the 19<sup>th</sup> SFRRI 2018, hosted by SFRR-Europe, would be held in Lisbon, Portugal from 12-15 July 2017. Giovanni Mann reported that Joao Laranjinha, the local organising committee together with the SFRR-Europe Executive intended to schedule 16 plenary symposia and would be placing a call for symposia proposals and plenary award lectures on the SFRRI and SFRR-Europe websites. All submitted symposia and plenary lecture nominations would be evaluated and ranked by an international scientific committee as for SFRRI meetings held in London 2012, Kyoto 2014 and San Francisco 2016.

Subsequent SFRRI biennial meetings are planned Asia/Australasia in 2020 and the Americas in 2022. Shinya Toyokuni informed the General Assembly that he would be liaising with potential hosts of the 20<sup>th</sup> SFRRI Meeting. The Executive further highlighted the importance of regional Societies providing financial support for a host SFRR Society, based the success of the SFRRI meetings held in London 2012, Kyoto 2014 and San Francisco 2016.
