- 1. Report from President Roland Stocker (joined online via ZOOM)
- Focused on revision of Byelaws/Statues, officer positions, election of new President-Elect, SFRRI Treasurer to reside in UK, SFRRI ECR Travel Grants, ratification of changes to Byelaws, elections at General Assembly, and updating SFRRI Website.
- Thanked SFRR-Europe for hosting the 22nd SFRRI Biennial Meeting, which attracted >410 delegates from 40 countries.
- Highlighted that SFRRI Executive decided to have the election of officers in sync with the biennial meetings, noting that this had been disrupted by COVID-19. Roland Stocker will step down as President on 31 December 2025 (after 1 year term) and Hozumi Motohashi will begin her 2-year term as President on 1 January 2026.
- Informed international committee that the Executive had contacted all regional SFRR Societies
 to propose nominations for President-Elect position. Only 1 nomination was received for,
 which was for Prof. Maret Traber, whose nomination was supported by SFRRI Executive and
 would need to be ratified at the General Assembly on Thursday 5 June 2025.
- Explained the rationale for updating the Byelaws/Statues, which had not been updated since 2008. Nina Dickerhof queried the criteria for SFRRI Executive expelling a regional SFRR Society and Roland Stocker commented very rare but necessary to support SFRRI integrity.
- Informed all that SFRRI Executive would in future streamline applications for ECR Travel
 Awards by handling these via the SFRRI Executive if feasible. If candidate received a travel
 award from a regional SFRR Society, they could not double-dip and apply for an SFRRI travel
 award.
- Discussed liaising with Elsevier Publishers to clarify that all members of SFRRI are eligible for a 15% discount on Open Access, and whether institutions/regional societies receiving a 20-25% discount could claim the 15% from SFRRI-Elsevier on top.
- Minutes of this meeting and those of the General Assembly will be uploaded onto the SFRRI website, together with minutes from previous meetings.

• Highlighted that SFRR Asia will be hosting 23rd SFRRI Biennial Meeting in Sendai, Japan in 2027. The main Conference will be held at the Sendai International Center on March 29-31, with Satellite meetings at Tohoku University Seiryo Auditorium and Talknet Hall Sendai on March 28. Sendai has excellent travel connections, good subway, accommodation/food. The meeting would schedule 4 SFRRI Award Lectures (Trevor Slater, Lester Packer, Alberto Boveris, and Kelvin & Joanna Davies Rising Star) to be selected by an international scientific committee.

 Giovanni Mann commented that he had emailed the Guidelines for hosting SFRRI Biennial meetings to all regional SFRR Society Executives.

3. Report from General Secretary – Patricia Oteiza

- Apologised for only be able to join the meeting online and commented:
- Communication between the SFRRI Executive/General Secretary and regional SFRR Societies should be improved to ensure all regional members are aware of SFRRI activities and the call for nomination of SFRRI officers and biennial meeting symposia/award lectures.
- ECR members of the regional SFRR Societies may feel they are not included in the communications between SFRRI and the regional Societies.
- Encouraged all regional SFRR Executives to disseminate information received by email from the SFRRI General Secretary to their members, since SFRRI does not have access to contact details of members of the regional societies.

4. Report from Treasurer – Corinne M. Spickett

- Provided a summary of the SFRRI accounts.
- HSBC bank balance has been stable over the past 5 years
- Will have the 2024 annual accounts audited by Mrs Marion Raeside for submission to the UK Charity Commission in October.
- A new HSBC mandate has been set up, so CMS now has access to the account. Future tasks are to change the bank address and Charity Commission address for SFRRI to Aston University
- Thanked regional SFRR Societies for their continued regional dues support.
- Highlighted the financial support received from the regional SFRR Societie for SFRR-Europe to host the 22nd SFRRI Biennial Meeting in Galway, Ireland 3-6 June 2025.
- SFRRI supported a number of related outreach meetings after receiving applications, noting all supported meetings need to submit a final report to SFRRI.
- Corinne Spickett and Patricia Oteiza to review and circulate meetings supported and reports received from Societies and organisations supported by SFRRI.

 Through the "Redox Future Perspective Forum" and the Satellite meeting on Oct. 24, 2024, two key objectives emerged with broad consensus: To outline a roadmap for the future of redox biology and medicine. To advance the International Redox-Decode Project (RDP).

- Next SFRR Asia Biennial Meeting in Chiang Mai, Thailand 16-18 December 2026.
